Birth of Hope

Robin reaches over impulsively to give her 4-yearold granddaughter, Hannah, a hug. It's Sunday morning and Robin, Hannah and her mother stand side by side as they sing together during church at The Foundry Rescue Mission and Recovery Center's Worship Center. "Thank you, God, for restoring my family," Robin prays quietly.

Just five months earlier, a friend brought Robin, 44, to The Foundry. Struggling with a four-year addiction to drugs and estranged from her two adult children, Robin needed more than just a place to rehabilitate—she needed a refuge from years of abuse and rejection.

"After my husband and I divorced in 1994, me and my children just slowly went down. My mother said it was like I jumped off a cliff and she couldn't catch me," recalls Robin, who admits her husband was physically and emotionally abusive. "After that, I got involved with a man who was no good and used drugs, then I started using drugs, too."

At The Foundry, Robin gave her heart to Jesus and began to grow in confidence as she realized God had always been with her and would be her strength now. "It was like God was welcoming me home," she says today. "My family was afraid I wouldn't stay, but His hands were on my shoulders and I knew this was where I belonged."

Robin yearned to restore her relationship with her daughter and be a support to her. Soon her daughter agreed to attend church with Robin at our Worship Center. Each Sunday, Robin, her daughter and Hannah sat together, enjoying the singing and listening to God's Word. In time, Robin's daughter rededicated her life to Christ.

"I could never have imagined what God's done in just five months!" Robin says gleefully. "He has delivered me and my family! He has poured out His blessings on my children."

This Christmas, Robin looks forward to spending time with her family as they celebrate Christ's birth together. "I want to be a whole and good mother to my children and grandchildren," she says. "Knowing Christ is the Lord of my life, Christmas will be more meaningful."

At Christmas, The Foundry will extend gifts of hope to our residents as we celebrate God's Gift of Hope, Jesus Christ. Thank you for sharing your love and generosity with the homeless and addicted during this holy season.
